Some parents have asked "what would happen if there was a case at Newtown School?". As always we would follow the advice of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Health. For your information, this link outlines the process as directed by the Ministry of Education.

### What to do if there is a case of COVID-19 in your school or kura

- The MOE and MOH would support us to work our way through this process based on public health advice.
- We would support communications to the school community based on this public health advice. This communication would be via text message directly to whānau, email, and Facebook posts.
- Closing the school may or may not be required and would only occur in consultation with direction from Health or in discussion with the Director of Education.

  risk of transmission. This information is linked to the rollout of the new traffic light system. We are
  sure that more details will follow in the coming days/weeks.

Come and see the friendly and knowledgeable team anytime during general opening hours:



Public consultation is underway by Let's Get Wellington Moving around mass rapid transit, which is the very latest type of public transport that will move more people around more quickly and reliably.

More of us need to leave our cars at home to make a real dent in our carbon emissions and will only do it if we have superior public transport.

Great public transport encourages housing development as people want to live close to it, and we have a housing crisis so this is hugely important.

As a member of our school whanau we urge you to have your say on the proposed four options – all of them connect the railway station to Island Bay and go right past our school, all of them will transform the way we, and our children, will get around the city.

Let's Get Wellington Moving is made up of Wellington City Council, Greater Wellington Regional Council, Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency, with the support of mana whenua partners.

They need to pick which option goes to the next stage and gets built – and they need feedback from the public to help them decide.

We will make a submission on behalf of our school but it's all about people power so make sure you have you say before consultation closes on 10 December 2021.
